Protecting That Place We Call Home

Over the years we have acted with other organizations, such as Hurn Parish Council, and with local Ward Councillors to protect our environment.

When a European Directive was cited as an excuse to fell 20,000 trees on St Catherine's Hill we mobilized local support and opinion and put a stop to that venture.

We helped to create the Management Group that now manages the trees and their environment on The Hill and we have a representative on that committee that speaks for local residents.

When Dorset Council decided to build a waste processing plant at Hurn we

joined forces with Hurn and Ferndown and made them see sense. The plans were dropped and they admitted that their scheme would have produced an expensive white elephant.

Those were big issues. Most of the time by talking regularly to Council Officers and our Ward Councillors we head off trouble before an issue becomes too serious.

All of this only works because we have a large membership and are known to reflect majority opinion

Membership costs just £1 per household per year. We do hope you will feel motivated to join us.
