www.wcresidents.co.uk Committee Meeting Minutes The Hall on the Hill: 1<sup>st</sup> June at 7.30 pm

In these minutes: ACRA=Affiliation of Christchurch Residents Associations; ARC=Amphibian and Reptile Conservation (previously known as HCT=Herpetological Conservation Trust); BWHW=Bournemouth and West Hants Water; CBC=Christchurch Borough Council; DCC=Dorset County Council; EDDC=East Dorset District Council; FOSCH=Friends of St Catherine's Hill; NE=Natural England; RA=Residents Association; SSSI=Site of Special Scientific Interest (Town Common and St Catherine's Hill for example); TPO=Tree Preservation Order; WCRA=West Christchurch RA; WW=Wessex Water

- 1. **Present**: Chairman Jim Biggin; Maureen Biggin; Chris Gordon; Roger Hamilton Eileen Lancaster; John Pendrill; Janet Robson;
- 2. Minutes of last meeting: The minutes of 4<sup>th</sup> May 2011 were approved.
- **3. Treasurer's Report**: John Pendrill submitted accounts as at 1<sup>st</sup> June 2011 showing an excess of expenditure over income of £341.82 with cash at bank of £5036.64 (£4848.27 on deposit). It was noted that: 2011 subscriptions had started to arrive in the bank; printing costs are likely to be high in 2011 as material concerning the St Catherine's Hill Management Plan is produced for distribution to residents.
- **4. Debit Cards and Payment of Subscriptions in Advance**: *it was resolved that* John Pendrill would investigate this matter
- **5. Membership**: Maureen Biggin reported four new collectors now in action; to date four collectors (including one new one) have deposited funds of £186. *It was resolved that* John Pendrill will establish the cost of providing collectors with higher quality collection badges
- **6. Delegate to ACRA**: John Pendrill reported that the June quarterly meeting is imminent; he and Jim Biggin are scheduled to meet the CBC Chief Executive and his strategic team at the end of June; the general all round dissatisfaction with the airport £2.50 drop-off charge is likely to be aired again.
- **7. FOSCH:** the ARC representative is leaving the committee; the sand trap at the top of Sandy Lane is apparently the responsibility of DCC; a fire near the junction of Fairmile and St Catherine's Hill Lane caused by a wind toppled tree brining down electricity cables had been brilliantly dealt with by the fire service.
- 8. ARC: nothing new to report.
- 9. The Hall on the Hill: nothing new to report.
- **10. St Catherine's Hill Management Plan:** Jim Biggin confirmed that the Committee Meeting of 10<sup>th</sup> May had referred the draft plan back to the facilitators for considerable rewriting. CBC is producing a progress report for distribution to residents. It is estimated that 2,200 copies are required to be distributed by committee members plus any volunteers
- 11. Planning Issues: a proposal that envisaged building on land annexed from <u>27</u> <u>River Way</u>, turned down by CBC, has gone to appeal; two previous appeals regarding the demolition of garages in and around <u>Darwin Avenue</u> and <u>Melbourne Road</u> to be replaced by houses have been rejected but one has been upheld and building permission granted. Following a suggestion made by ACRA the weekly CBC summary of planning applications will in future be distributed in electronic form.
- 12. WCRA Web Site: the site has been kept up to date and has functioned normally

- **13. The E-Mail Newsletter:** the May letter was distributed normally. Jim Biggin reported that 2011 collections had yielded over 100 new e-mail addresses so far and the total circulation now exceeded 600
- **14. Dorset Police and RTA**: the response by Dorset Police to the ACRA letter was considered. It was resolved that ACRA should be asked to refer the matter to Chris Chope MP
- **15. Public Consultation The Forestry Panel:** *it was resolved that* Chris Gordon will draft a response on our behalf. Individual members should also reply on their own behalf.
- **16. DCC Budgetary Control:** John Pendrill outlined fresh concerns that have arisen over the DCC budget deficit. *It was resolved that* ACRA will be asked to seek a further meeting with Councillor Spenser Flower in the autumn
- **17.68 Hurn Road:** noted that a complaint had been received concerning the building rubble that has been dumped on the grass verge outside 68 Hurn Road. *It was resolved that* the complaint be passed on to CBC
- **18. Next Meeting:** the next meeting would normally be in September. However, with so much going on it was agreed to meet in both July and August. *It was resolved that* Jim Biggin will try to book the Hall on the Hill
- 19. The meeting closed at 9.15 pm. Next formal committee meeting is on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2011 at 7.30pm, venue to be announced
